A phrase in common use to describe the world's biggest content providers, by measure of traffic and global presence. These might well include (but are not limited to):

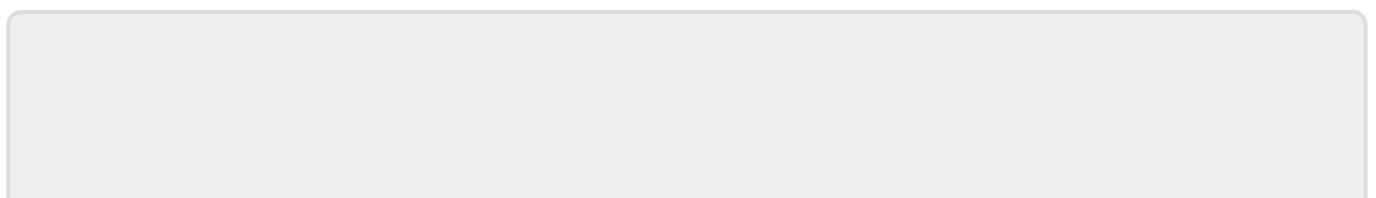

gTLD & ccTLD

gTLD means "General Top Level Domain" and refers to operators of the generic top level domains, such as .com, .net, .org, etc.

ccTLD means "country code Top Level Domain" and refers to operators of the country top level domains.
