A phrase in common use to describe the world's biggest content providers, by measure of traffic and global presence. These might well include (but are not limited to):

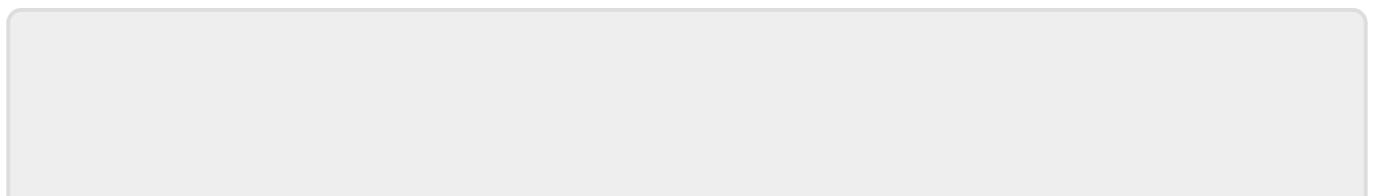

## gTLD & ccTLD

**gTLD** means "Generic Top Level Domain" and refers to operators of the generic top level domains, such as .com, .net, .org, etc.

**ccTLD** means "country code Top Level Domain" and refers to operators of the country top level domains.
